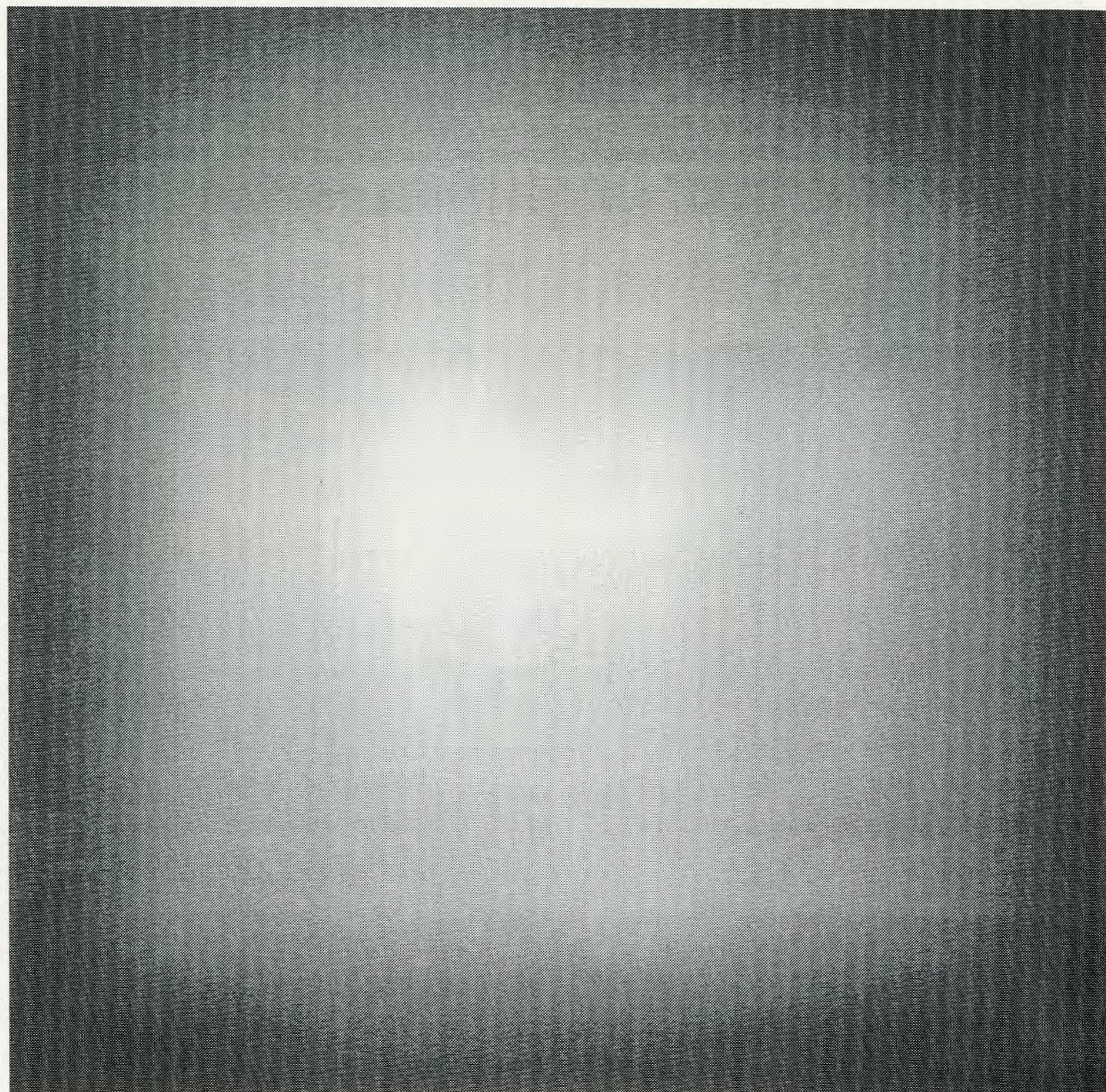

Erika Ranee

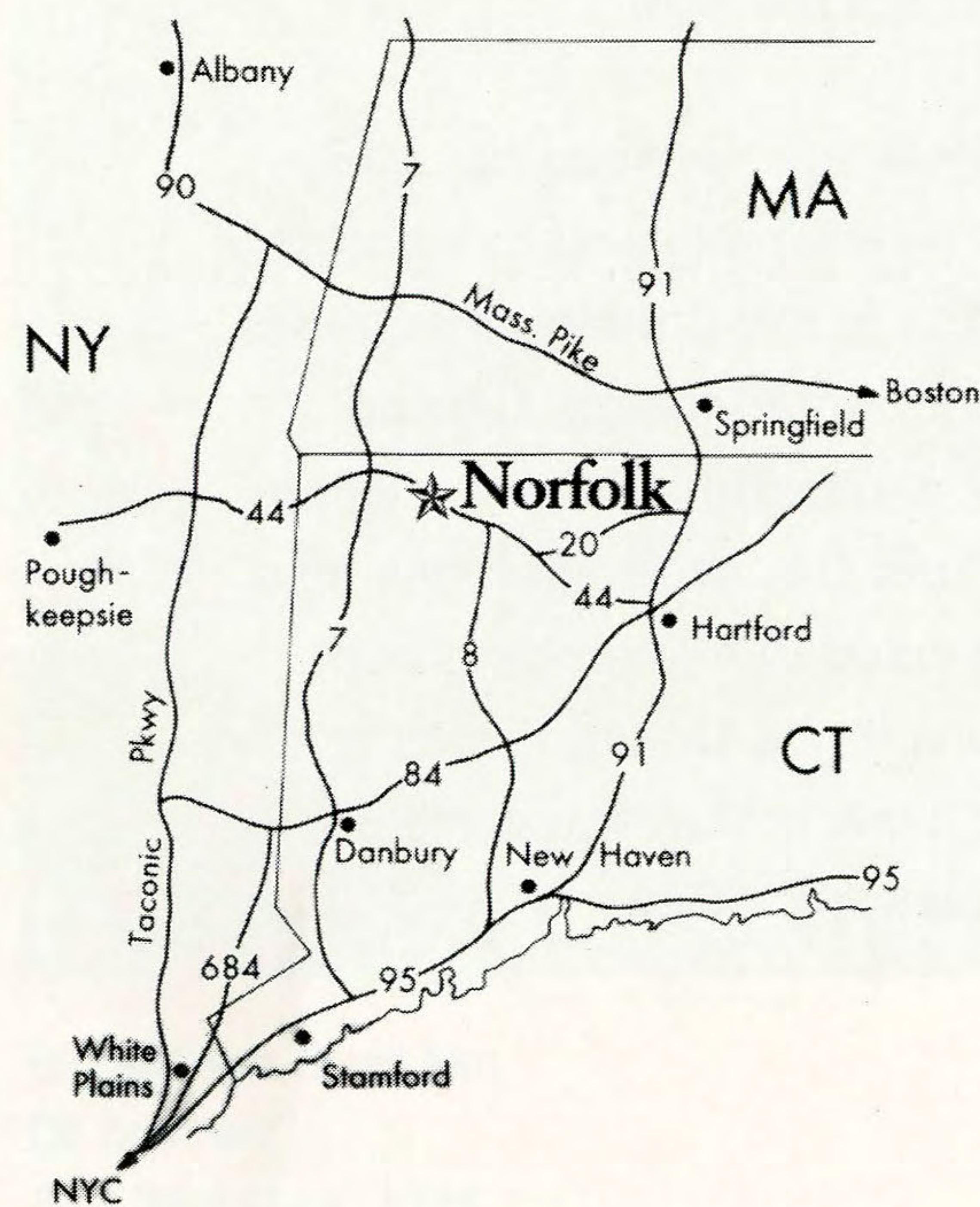
